### **What is Family Child Care (FCC)?**

Family Child Care is a home in which care is provided for one or more children for more than 10 hours a week, or on a regular basis.

### **What is a Family Child Care Provider?**

A Family Child Care Provider is a person licensed by the Fairchild AFB FCC office to care for infants and young children in his/her home.

### **How can a FCC Provider be identified?**

Fairchild FCC providers have a FAMILY CHILD CARE sign on their house or in their house window or attached to the front of their house.

### **Are we in need of Family Child Care Providers?**

YES! There is always a need for quality care that is offered in a loving, safe environment. With dual and single working parents, the need for child care is increasing daily.

### **Do you have to live on Fairchild AFB in order to become a provider?**

NO! You can live off base and be affiliated with TAFB Family Child Care. Providers who do live on base do so in these housing areas:

### **FCC Provider Benefits**

- Stay at home with your own children and earn income at the same time.
- Providers are reimbursed for providing nutritional meals to the children in their care.
- A fun way to enhance children's development and socialization.
- Resource Center - Large program filled with developmentally appropriate toys, games, books, etc. to fill your shelves. You can use these items at no charge to you.
- Opportunities to attend educational trainings. These opportunities will help you with ideas for your discipline children as well as your own children. Enjoyable trainings will help you gain knowledge in child development and child guidance.
- Complete local background screenings for potential providers and their families.
- Providers are placed on a monthly availability list. This list is made available to base agencies and lists the openings in each provider's day care.
- Food Handler's Certification
- Annual CPR and First Aid Training
- Resource Referrals
- Fire, Health and Safety Inspections
- Fun, exciting way to be with children

Family Child Care program accepts children with chronic health problems, including HIV positive children, for care and employs persons and agencies as family child care providers individuals with chronic health problems including HIV positive individuals.
